## Alumnae Weekend, October 16-17, 1970

Alumnae Weekend meant different things to different people, but to all it meant reminiscence, fun, sightseeing, and good food.

### Registration

Alumnae Weekend jumped off to an enthusiastic start at 2 p.m., Friday, October 16, with registration in the Student Center. Alumnae congregated to immediately set a festive air which was to beautifully pervade the whole weekend. The enthusiasm just did not occur on its own. It was the result of planning and hard work by the Weekend Chairman, Sue FLETCHER Cornett, '63, and the Alumnae Director, Lucille Furrow. Brochures were mailed out to all alumnae, special letters went out to reunion classes, and the fall issue of the Alumnae Magazine carried an article to alert the alums to start making plans for their return to the College.

Refreshments and cookies were available at Friday's afternoon registration. Many had traveled hundreds of miles. On hand to greet the early arrivals were Mrs. Furrow, Sue FLETCHER Cornett, '63, Angela ATWELL Hopkins, '60, Nancy SHELL, '56, Susanne UFER Nininger, '54, and Peggy SNODGRASS, '56.

### Song Contest

The 29th annual song contest was held at 7:30 p.m., Friday, in Harrison-Jones Memorial Hall. The song contest is an annual event, sponsored by the Athletic Association for the purpose of developing school spirit and uniting the classes. It is looked forward to by the students as the biggest event of the fall. Miss Katherine KESNER, '34, a teacher in the Bristol, Tennessee, school system, and Dr. and Mrs. Graham Landrum of King College were the judges for the contest.

Mr. H. B. Brady is sponsor of the freshman class and Peggy Sanmartini is the song leader. Mrs. Harvey L. Creasy is sponsor of the sophomore class and Debbie Gallen the song leader.

Each class sang a pep song and a proclamation song. The sophomore class performed first.

The freshman pep song was certainly clever and put everyone in the right frame of mind as one could hear muffled laughter throughout the hall. After the sophomore performance the junior class went on stage and sang a revised version of their proclamation song. They were great. They did not want to compete against the other two classes for the award.

Dr. Norman Nunn, academic dean, was chosen to announce the winner. Before announcing the winner (the sophomore class), in his inimitable way he read the Daily Routine of Duties from the 1895 catalog: "Rising bell at 6:30 a.m.; breakfast at 7:30 a.m.; opening exercises from 8:30 to 8:45 a.m., recitations from 8:45 to 12:45 p.m.; dinner at 1 p.m.; recitations from 2 to 4 p.m.; supper at 6 p.m.; study period from 7 to 9:45 p.m., retiring bell at 9:45 p.m., lights out and house quiet at 10 p.m.

"Pupils on arising will put their rooms in order for the inspection of the Matron, and scrupulous attention to neatness in person and surroundings will be expected at all times.

"Pupils are required to spend an hour on Saturday morning in arranging their rooms, repairing clothing, etc.

"Sabbath visiting cannot be allowed and hence the young ladies are not allowed to receive or make calls on that day.

"Pupils will not be permitted to receive the visits or attentions of gentlemen, except at occasional receptions, and then under such restrictions as the President may scribe. Should parents desire, in exceptional cases, that

such visits should be made, they are requested to write directly to the President on the subject, and only such permits will be received.

"Young ladies will not be permitted to leave the ground without a teacher.

"Requests have frequently been received from parents that their daughters be allowed to make business or social visits. Such visits will not be allowed, except under extraordinary circumstances. Visits, even in the immediate neighborhood, will be discouraged, except at rare intervals and under careful restrictions. Experience has abundantly proved that pupils cannot go much into society and at the same time attend properly to their school duties.

"Parents will consult the welfare of their daughters by limiting their correspondence while they are at the Institute, as far as possible, to their immediate family circle. Aside from the waste of time it involves, there are other objections to a system of promiscuous letter-writing which must be obvious to all. As a rule, our most contented and most successful students are those who do the least visiting and write and receive the fewest letters."



Continuing to read from the 1895 Catalog, Dr. Nunn commented that the freshmen would enjoy this article under Physical Culture:

"Lung Gymnastics and Correct Breathing: Special attention is called to Lung Gymnastics and Breathing Exercises. These exercises are invaluable to those suffering with weak lungs, catarrh, asthma, throat trouble, and all affections of the breathing organs. If you have weak daughters with narrow, sunken chests, send them to take this course, and you will be surprised and gratified at the results. This course can be taken along or in connection with the Physical Culture in the Gymnasium or with Elocution. It is advisable for the suffering from ill health to take these lessons privately, and, in fact, this course is only given in private lessons. The pupil thereby has the entire attention of the teacher during the lesson, and her own special weakness can be attended to and treated. Lessons in Anatomy and Physiology of the breathing organs are given. By this knowledge pupils will understand how to care for their own health. Consumption is the curse of the race, because people starve their lungs. There are some people who do not know what it is to take a deep, full breath. Of course in this work corsets will have to be abandoned while the pupil is under treatment, and let us hope that when she grows stronger, and gradually well, she will never again wear those girdling machines."

#### President's Reception

Following the song contest the alumnae went to the home of Dr. and Mrs. Floyd V. Turner, for the traditional president's tea. The home was decorated with colorful fall flowers. Mrs. Turner's home is always beautiful and her receptions are lovely.

Anne ROWELL Worrell, '39, was in charge of the reception and much credit goes to her for the lovely flower arrangements. Mrs. Worrell had Smith Floral deliver corsages to Mrs. Floyd Turner and Mrs. Furrow and the other ladies assisting at the reception.

Registration continued Saturday morning. While waiting for the general meeting of the Association, the alumnae enjoyed visiting and touring the campus.

#### General Meeting of the Alumnae Association

The first business was the election of new officers. Mrs. Furrow commented that she had arranged the program in this manner so that the new president could take over upon being elected. (The president and first vice president were both absent.) There were no nominations from the floor. Mrs. Furrow asked the Secretary to read the slate of officers which appeared in the fall issue of the Alumnae Magazine. The slate of officers was accepted by the membership and Virginia SANGID Fagan, '55, the newly elected president, immediately took the chair.

All business coming before the Association was properly handled. To conclude the program Mrs. Furrow gave her annual report. In closing she commented:



"People, people who need people are the luckiest people in the world.

"Well, if this be true, then I number myself among the luckiest people in the world. Without your help my work would be useless and impossible. Your help makes the Alumnae Fund the success that it is, the magazine what it is, and Alumnae Weekend what it is.

After a prayer, he commented that he would be speaking to the assembly later that evening at the banquet. The food and decorations were under the direction of the A.R.A. Food Service, with Mr. Frank Schramm, manager. Gwen LANG Smith, '46, was the chairman for the luncheon.

The food at the luncheon was delicious and the service could not have been better. #### Alumnae Banquet

Mr. C. Ernest Cooke gave the invocation at the Alumnae Banquet, 7:00 p.m., October 17, 1970.

The menu for the dinner consisted of chilled tomato juice with lemon slice; baked boneless breast of chicken with creamed butter gravy, garnished with a spiced apple ring and parsley sprig; hashed creamed potatoes, buttered peas and mushrooms; individual molded gelatine salad; miniature sweet muffins and dinner rolls with butter, choice of beverage—coffee or iced or hot tea.

The carved pumpkins and the harvest display were still intact and bud vases and candles were on the tables. The tables were covered with gold-colored cloths. Needless to say, the room could not have been more beautiful.

Dr. Turner spoke on "Virginia Intermont Today". He spoke of the transition period to a 4-year institution, he mentioned that the evaluation team would be on campus for several days to help in making this giant step, and he spoke of the need for a new library. He asked for help in reaching these goals. As he spoke, he radiated faith in the new V.I. and his audience was most enthusiastic. A question and answer period followed, which Dr. Turner handled so well.

Virginia SANGID Fagan, '55, made some special recognitions. A gift was given to the girl coming from the greatest distance, Boston, Massachusetts. A gift went to a member of the class of 1960, as the oldest class having a member wearing the class ring. Lorena AUER Leist, '44, of Rich Creek, Virginia, was presented a gift as the alum having the most children, six. There was a tie, but Mrs. Leist represented the older class. Nancy OSBORNE Spurgeon, '60, of Columbia, South Carolina, was the winner of a gift for the alum who had moved the most.

A gift for the alumna who had attended Alumna Week-end or Alumnae Day the most times proved to be quite interesting. Mary Alma WALKER McChesney, '18, of Bristol, Virginia, was still counting when the contest had ended. She had counted forty-eight attendances and Mrs. Alpha GOUGE Tate, '18, of Wise, Virginia, had counted up to about thirty-eight attendances.

The oldest class represented was 1917. A gift was presented to Margaret MINTER Sexton.

Mrs. Lucille Furrow accepted a gift for Claire COHEN Hill, '53, in her absence. Mrs. Furrow commented: "Claire has been in and out of alumnae affairs since her graduation from Virginia Intermont. After receiving an M.A. from Vanderbilt she joined our faculty. She has represented the College on numerous occasions. She has been a fine president. I shall mail this gift, a pewter mug, to her."

Connie Baker, a sophomore from Bristol, Virginia, sang two songs: "What the World Needs Now is Love" and "I'll catch the Sun." She was accompanied by Mr. William L. Adams, a faculty member, at the piano.

#### Alumna-of-Year Award

Dr. Genora McFADDIN was the recipient of the Alumna-of-Year Award. This presentation was made by Mrs. Lucille Furrow, Executive Secretary of Virginia Intermont College Alumnae Association. The recipient was unaware of this award and her identity was kept a secret from the audience until at the last.

Mrs. Furrow commented:

"A teacher affects Eternity; she can never tell where her influences reach. The Alumna-of-Year for 1970, a graduate of Virginia Intermont College, has recently returned to Bristol to make her home.

"Upon graduation from Virginia Intermont, being a native of this area, she began teaching in the adjoining counties.

"In 1928 she received a B.S. degree from the University of Virginia. In 1931 she received the M.A. degree from the University of Michigan. In 1948 she received the Ph.D. from Peabody.

"Her background has been both academic and professional. She may be described as a world traveler. One of her most pleasant overseas visits was in Hongkong to the home of Yiu Fong Leung, a student from 1916-20. This visit was made while on a world tour in 1963. She has visited the Holy Land twice. On all of her tours she was accompanied by a teacher and had the time and pleasure to see what she wanted and to stay as long as she wanted to in any particular place. She only had one organized tour, and that was for safety reasons to the Communistic Countries.

"She represents a Virginia Intermont family. Her sisters attended Virginia Intermont; nieces attended Virginia Intermont. She has kept in close contact with the College and has supported it with financial contributions.

"Now retired, she finds life just as exciting. She continues to give of herself and of the knowledge she has gained through the years to others. She devotes much of her time to writing, reading, gardening, weaving, community work and church work. She teaches a Sunday School Class at First Baptist Church in Bristol; she is a member of the missionary society; she teaches music to the children in her family. She lives in a friendly neighborhood and enjoys visiting with her neighbors.

"Her most recent position was Academic Dean at Truett-McConnell College. May I introduce you to the lovely and charming Dr. Genora McFADDIN."

Mrs. Furrow pinned a white orchid on Dr. McFADDIN and presented her with a properly engraved silver bowl. Dr. McFADDIN commented that she now knew why Mrs. Furrow had invited her several weeks ago to visit the Col-

## REMEMBERS VIRGINIA INTERMONT IN HER WILL

Marcia Flagg SKETCHLEY, '65, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. William E. Sketchley, of 609 Montgomery School Lane, Wynnwood, Pennsylvania, was born on August 19, 1942, and died on January 2, 1970. Although Marcia was born with muscular dystrophy, it never affected her personality or dimmed her determination to succeed. She never asked special favors. She accepted her responsibility with courage and because of this courage she became an inspiration to all the girls who knew her.

Marcia contributed annually to the VICTORY Fund, and she remembered Virginia Intermont College in her will. Her graduation from Virginia Intermont College was her fondest memory.

An outstanding student at Virginia Intermont College, Marcia tried a number of different things after graduation, but she finally found her real vocation in reading to the blind—starting with a blind graduate student, a blind teacher, and then several blind rehabilitation counselors who were working for the State in Philadelphia. She formed real friendships with these men, and took tremendous interest in their problems and accomplishments, as they did with her. She also did some remedial tutoring, helped with clerical work at the Junior Red Cross, and took voice lessons.

Her greatest delight was travel. She preferred to go by herself so that her handicaps would not slow down any one person for the entire trip. She always found someone to give her a helping hand. In 1966 she went to Greece and to the Mediterranean Islands. During this trip all her luggage was stolen, but she came home with some Greek dresses and many superb color pictures. In 1967 she went to Alaska via the Inland Passage, and was so enthusiastic that she returned the next year, just for the boat trip up and back. She also went by train and bus all over the eastern part of the country, visiting friends from college and going to their weddings.

In March, 1969, she underwent an operation for a tumor, which the doctors warned her parents would come back. She recovered from the operation very well and was able to continue her singing lessons, complete a

course in computer programming, and go to her brother's graduation from college. When she returned to the hospital in the fall she never grew discouraged, but was constantly planning ahead. Fortunately she was able to be home for Christmas, but she was downhearted at not being able to sing with the choir at the Christmas Eve service (she had sung with them since she was 15), but she was much uplifted when several of them came around before the service to sing her a special carol. After Christmas she seemed to let go, and died in her sleep on January 2, 1970. One of her doctors said: "Marcia was pursued by the barbs of fate, but she never complained."

Marcia was a rare person. Such enthusiasm for life and love of others is seldom seen in an individual. Her life and influence at Virginia Intermont College will long be remembered. Virginia Intermont College is grateful that through her will she has remembered that part of her life which was "her fondest memory."

### WOMEN IN OUR LIFE

Two women who have been closely associated with Virginia Intermont College were honored with resolutions of appreciation recently adopted by the Executive Committee of the Trustees of King College, Bristol, Tennessee. Named in the honors were Miss Marguerite Pflug and Mrs. Joseph C. Leslie (Mary GRAY, '36).

Miss Pflug taught at Virginia Intermont for forty-three years before joining the faculty at King College. She had been associate professor of Modern Foreign Languages at King since 1957 and retired at the close of the 1969-70 academic year.

A native of Austria, Miss Pflug is a graduate of J. B. Stetson University and holds the master of arts degree from Columbia University. She has also done further study at the University of Berlin, the University of Geneva, and Columbia University.

A native of Abingdon, a graduate of Mitchell College, Statesville, N. C., Mrs. Leslie came to Virginia Intermont for her business training. She served as assistant to the Business Manager of King College from 1958 until several months ago when she resigned. She and her husband are the parents of two children: Lt. David Leslie of the U. S. Army, and Jo Marie Leslie.

### FORMER BRISTOLIAN, DAVID S. PEOPLES, HEADS R. J. REYNOLDS

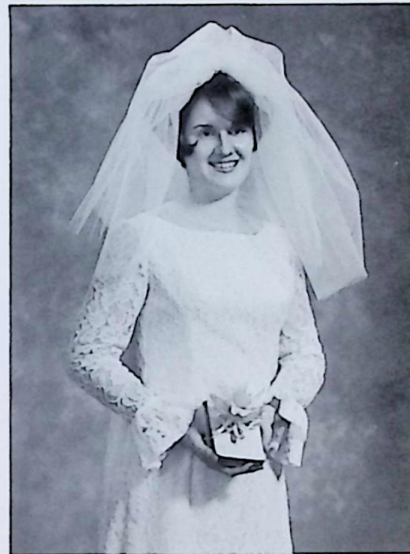

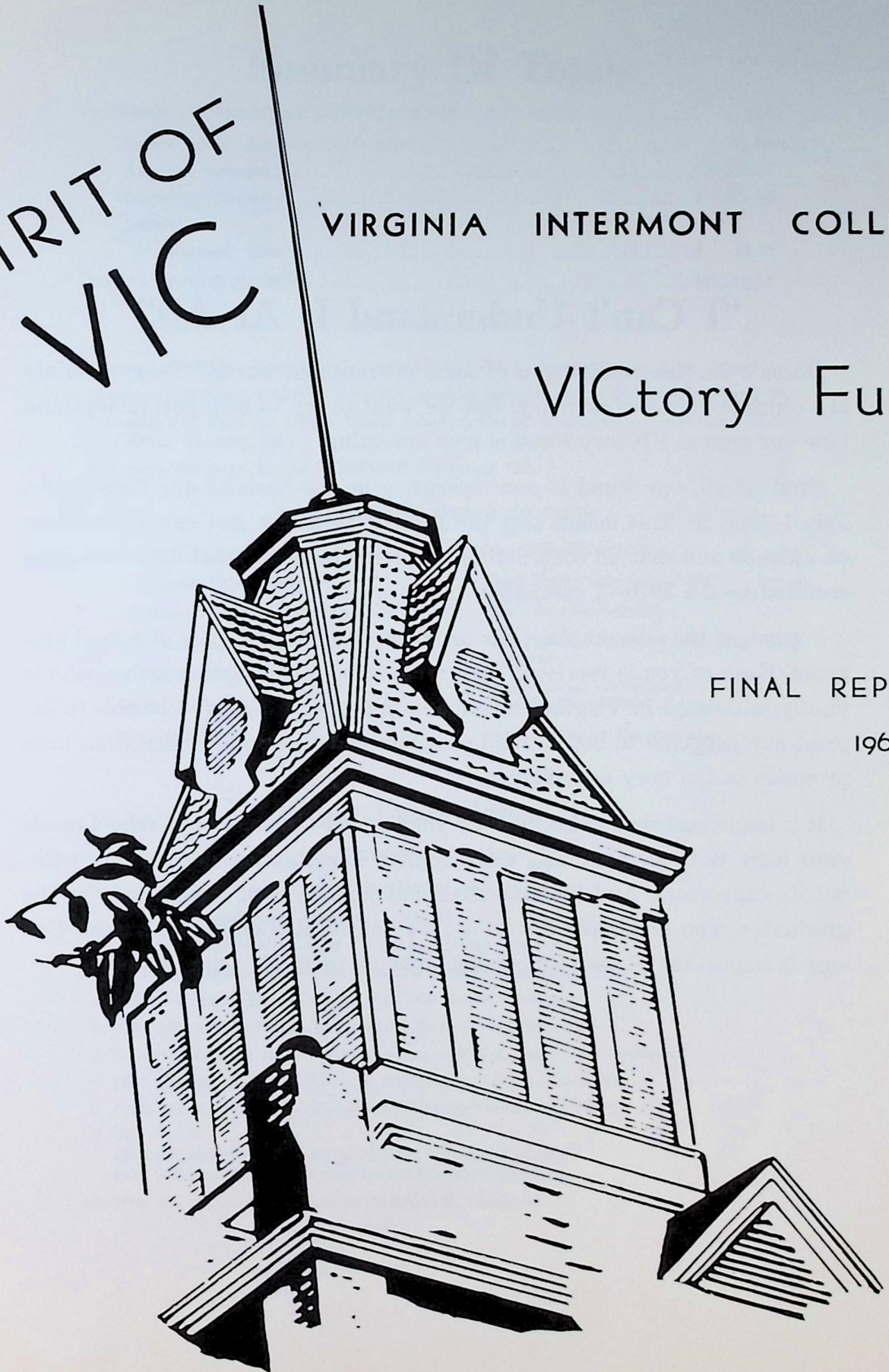
